


Dwarf Small Leaf Clusia

GROWTH & HABITAT

SIZE: up to 5', usually 2'-3' tall with

2'-3' spread

USDA HARDINESS ZONE: 10-12

SOIL: well drained **SALT TOLERANCE:** high

ORIGIN: Related to the native Clusia rosea but not known to be native to

Florida, possibly from South/Central America

DESIGN & AESTHETICS

SHAPE: multi trunk low shrub

LANDSCAPE USE: groundcover, massing, container plant

FLOWER: rare, small white/ light pink

FRUIT: N/A WILDLIFE: N/A

PLANT DESCRIPTION: The Dwarf Small Leaf Clusia is a great groundcover option for South Florida. The small succulent-like paddle shaped leaves add a nice texture to the landscape. The low growing and spreading nature makes this Clusia a great alternative to Green Island Ficus with much less maintenance.
