Ilex x attenuata 'Eagleston'

SMALL CANOPY TREE

GROWTH & HABITAT

SIZE: 20'-25' tall, 6'-10' wide

USDA HARDINESS ZONE: 6-9

SALT TOLERANCE: Low to Moderate

ORIGIN: Florida Native, cross between Florida native Dahoon Holly & native American Holly

LIGHT: Full Sun to Partial Shade



MOISTURE: Moderate; Drought tolerant once established



DESIGN & AESTHETICS

SHAPE: Upright columnar growth habit with dense foliated branches. Narrow and taller than it is wide.

LANDSCAPE USE: Street tree, residential yard tree, screening hedge

FLOWER: Small white flowers in clusters, blooms in spring

FRUIT: Red berries in fall and winter

WILDLIFE: Birds

PLANT DESCRIPTION: Small canopy tree with pyramidal shape. Dense evergreen foliage of medium green leaves with soft spines; red berries. Can be used as a hedge, a standard tree form or grown full to base.
